





- No support
- No accession numbers
- No dates
- No plant sources
- No quantities
- No records of plant death or removal
- Inconsistency in field use
- Inconsistency in field formatting/user error
- Back-ups limited
- Export only as .txt file
- Single-user access
- Not connected to internet or the cloud




- Quality of existing collection






